

SENATE BILL 13-177

CONCERNING CHANGES TO JUVENILE CORRECTIONS PROGRAMS RESULTING IN COST REDUCTIONS, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, REDUCING THE JUVENILE DETENTION BED CAP, REDUCING THE APPROPRIATION FOR COMMITMENT BEDS AND ASSESSMENT SERVICES, AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR TRANSPORTATION.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

**SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 19-2-1201, **amend** (2); and **add** (3) as follows:

- **19-2-1201. Juvenile detention bed cap.** (2) For the fiscal year 2011-12 and each fiscal year thereafter FROM JULY 1, 2012, THROUGH MARCH 31, 2013, the number of available juvenile detention beds statewide shall be limited to four hundred twenty-two.
- (3) From April 1, 2013, through June 30, 2013, and for the fiscal year 2013-14 and each fiscal year thereafter, the number of available juvenile detention beds statewide shall be limited to
