Communications Intern, Summer 2019

Are you passionate about justice system reform? Want to use your communications and technical skills to develop the channels to improve outcomes for children and youth involved in the justice system?

The National Juvenile Justice Network (NJJN) is looking for a passionate, dedicated, and self-motivated Communications Intern to join in our work to ensure that all youth are fairly treated by our justice system. He/she must be an undergraduate or graduate-level student, with a preference for those majoring in communications, journalism or public relations and having relevant coursework or work experience to provide support in the areas of journalism and communications.

NJJN communications intern shall use his/her research and writing skills plus communications experience to support a wide variety of NJJN's activities, including organizing webinars, interviewing members, maintaining NJJN's website, creating newsletters, writing articles, creating artwork for NJJN's digital use, and assisting with various tasks for NJJN's annual gathering. The intern must have moderate to excellent technical skills and can use graphic computer programs, including Adobe Premiere, Adobe Photoshop or similar programs. He/she must be able to work independently but can also work in a collaborative team environment and think creatively about all assignments. Experience or coursework in the field of youth justice is preferred but not required.
