Juvenile Justice Development Intern, Fall 2018

The National Juvenile Justice Network (NJJN) leads a movement of state-based juvenile justice reform organizations and alumni of its Youth Justice Leadership Institute to fight for a smaller youth justice system that's appropriate for youth and their families. NJJN advocates for policies and practices that treat youth in trouble with the law with dignity and humanity and which strengthen them, their families and their communities. Founded in 2005, NJJN is currently comprised of 51 organizational members in 42 states and the District of Columbia and a strong cadre of graduates from our Youth Justice Leadership Institute.

The National Juvenile Justice Network (NJJN) is looking for a passionate, dedicated, and self-motivated intern to help us further our work to ensure that all youth are fairly treated by our justice system. We are seeking a graduate-level intern (MPP, MPA, MBA or related) to provide fundraising support to the organization. The Development intern will work closely with the Executive Director and NJJN's fundraising team to support NJJN's overall fundraising efforts. Additionally, the intern will be charged with two distinct projects:

- 1) Developing a strategy to identify and connect to corporate donors, with a focus on start-up and tech corporations.
- 2) Researching new potential foundation partners and crafting letters of inquiry.

The intern must have excellent research and writing skills, the ability to work independently, and a demonstrated commitment to social justice. Experience or course work in the field of youth justice is preferred but not required. The intern must be able to work in a collaborative team environment and think creatively about all assignments.
